IN MEMORIUM - WILMA CLISO

Wilma N. Clisso, of Olathe, Kansas., passed away on Friday, December 29, 2006. She had been an active member of Olathe Chapter of NARFE until the chapter was closed.

She worked for the Federal Government as a switchboard operator at the Olathe Naval Air Station and was the last civilian employee there when the base closed. She transferred to Richards-Gebaur



Air Force Base in Belton, Mo., and held the position of Chief Operator there. Again, she was the last civilian employee working when that base closed. She retired with over 29 years of federal service in 1988.

After retiring, she turned to volunteer work with Olathe Hospice for over 15 years, leaving there in October 2005.

She was dedicated to helping others in their time of need.

Crocheting and knitting was a lifelong passion of hers. She made hundreds of slippers for hospice patients, lap covers for nursing home residents, hats and mittens for needy children and

these were just a few of her craft projects. One of her projects shown here is the 13-star "The Betsy Ross 1776 Flag" that she crocheted and used to raise money for Alzheimer's at the Olathe Federation convention. Congressman Dennis Moore on President Bush's Troop Escalation.

I recently issued the following statement, in response to President Bush's announcement of his new strategy in Iraq, including an increase of more than 20,000 American troops deployed to Iraq. I thought you might be interested in reading it.

"The President's troop escalation plan will not create a stable Iraq. I was hopeful that President Bush would understand that the American people are ready for a new direction with our involvement in Iraq. Unfortunately, the Presi-

dent's new strategy is more of the same. Ultimately, there has to be a political solution by Iraq and the Iraqi people if they are to stand on their own.

"I am disappointed that the President has ignored major issues raised by the Iraq Study Group, myself and others. We need an honest discussion about all options regarding the United States' presence in Iraq, including full, aggressive congressional oversight of the appropriate troop strength and the Administration's overall Iraq policy. This should not be about Democrats or Republicans, but deciding what is in the best interest of the American people.

"We saved the Iraqi people from Saddam Hussein, but we cannot

save the Iraqi people from the Iraqi people if they will not put aside centuries of religious and political differences and support their new government.

"Another troop escalation in Iraq will put a serious strain on our military resources. Instead of the same open-ended strategy to stay in Iraq, we need to consider options put forth by the Iraq Study Group, including a shift of security responsibility to the Iraqis and implementing an aggressive international diplomatic strategy to assist Iraq."

HR 32 Repeal of Government Pension Offset and Windfall Elimination Provision Re-Introduced in Congress

Legislation to entirely repeal both the Social Security Government Pension Offset (GPO) and Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) already introduced in the House now has a Senate companion. Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-CA) introduced S. 206 on January 9 with three cosponsors, Sens. Collins (R-ME), Snowe (R-ME) and Lautenberg (D-NJ). On January 4th, Rep. Howard Berman (D-CA) introduced H.R. 82, the House GPO/WEP Repeal bill with 103 original cosponsors including Rep. Buck McKeon (R-CA) the lead sponsor during the 109th Congress (2005-2006). NARFE members and allied groups recruited 327 cosponsors during the 109th Congress.

Congressman Dennis Moore (D,3rd) and Jerry Moran (R,1st) are cosponsors of Bill HR 32.

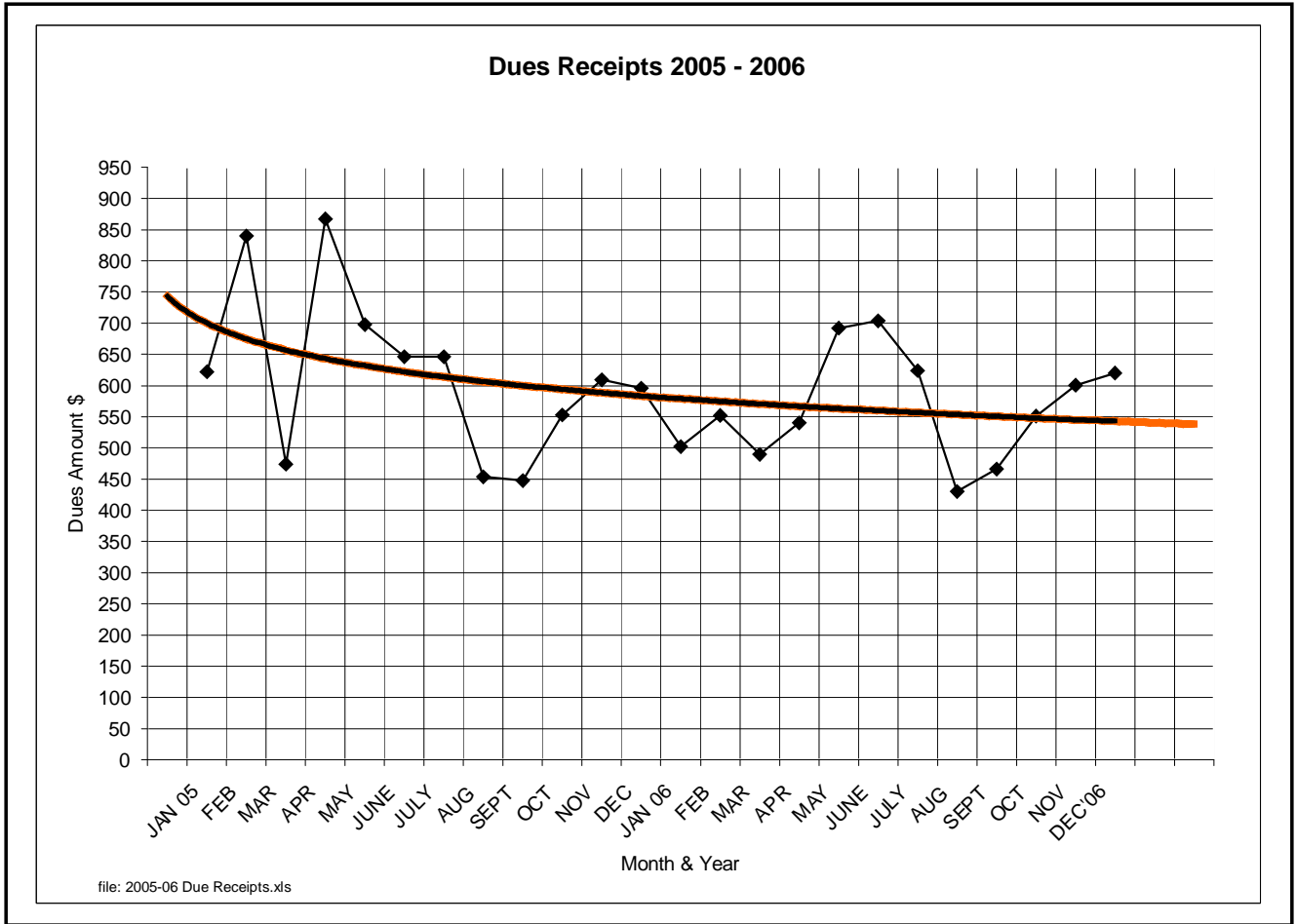

TREASURER'S REPORT – CHAPTER 1162 MEMBERSHIP

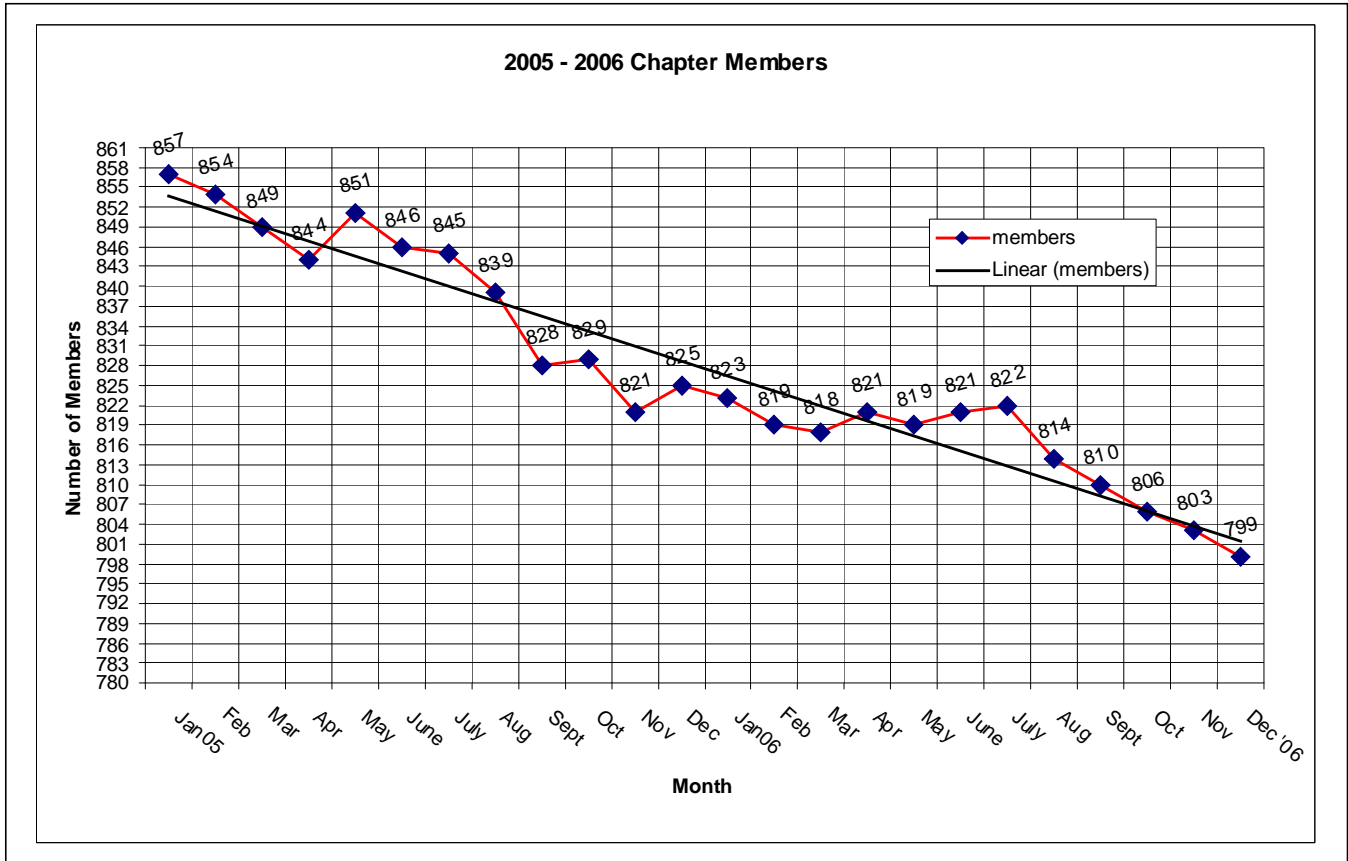
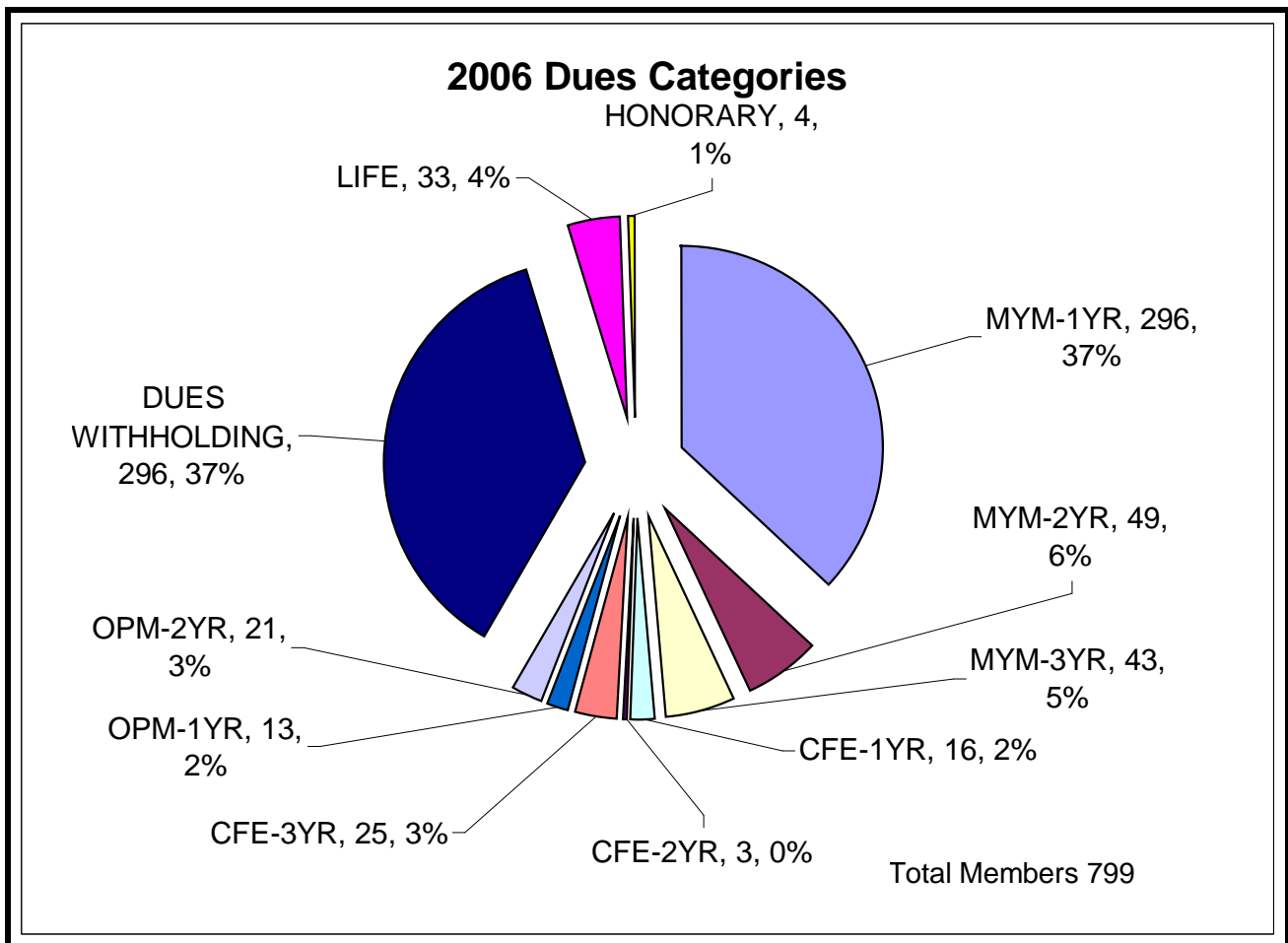


Chart depicts a continuous downward trend in chapter membership.
