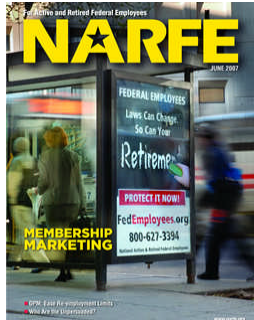

Junction City was the top chapter in the state donating \$5,000. The goal for 2006 was \$3.30 per member. The actual was \$3.89 per person. The recommended goal for each chapter is \$4.00 a person for 2007.

We were awarded a certificate of appreciation for being the number one fundraiser at the 2006 state convention raising \$3,800 from the live and silent auctions.

The National Headquarters Legislative team will also be there to answer questions and provide insight on where we have come from and what's in store for the future for NARFE.

The College of Knowledge is sponsored by NARFE's Region V Regional Vice President Richard (Dick) Thissen. As a member of our National Executive Board, Dick usually provides the "inside" information on the National Executive Board activities.

The College of Knowledge was started in 1996 by a Region V president and has continued with each succeeding regional president to the present time. It was originally billed, years ago, as a vacation for Narfers with some NARFE thrown in. However, it has grown in popularity over the years as a place for not only socializing but also to learn about our national programs, issues and so forth in a more
