John Surritte, President: NATIONAL NARFE LOBBY MONTH IS AUGUST 4 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 4, 2007.

We, in Kansas, have much to be pleased with regarding our priority Legislative Initiatives. Our Congressional Representatives in Districts 1, 2 and 3; Moran, Boyda and Moore support NARFE's desire to pass Premium Conversion and GPO/WEP Repeal. If you can, please send them a memo or email saying thanks. If you can stop by their local office, let them or their staffs know how much we appreciate their support. WE HAVE NOTHING MORE AT THIS TIME WE NEED FROM THEM SINCE THEY SUPPORT US AND HAVE EXHIBITED THE DESIRE TO MAINTAIN OUR PRESENT BENEFITS.

District 4's Representative, Congressman Tiahrt, is a different story. He supports none of our legislative initiatives. I'm not sure why he exhibits this behavior, however, August is the Month to try and change his mind. We, on the Federation Board, have done our part to bring Congressman Tiahrt on Board. However, the folks who can vote for him or against him are the ones who can get and keep his attention. That's all of you who reside in the 4th District.

On the Senate side, Senator Roberts now supports Premium Conversion. We all need to build on this and convince him to support GPO/WEP Repeal. I think we have a good opportunity to get his support. Senator Brownback seems to be a different story. Perhaps it's because he's running for President, but as of now, he has not signed on to support our Legislative Initiatives. Let us let him know with memos and emails that we're counting on him.

I have asked your Area Vice President to let me know by September 11 how you've done during National Lobby Month. Please do all you can.

Remember, August 27 though 29, 2007 are the dates for Dick Thissen's CONK in South Sioux City, NB. Also remember, the Federation has agreed to pay the registration fee for the first 38 Kansas attendees. If you're going to attend, thanks, if you're thinking about attending, please do.

In closing I'm pleased to see that you have raised over \$16,000 for Alzheimer's Research so far in 2007. This is excellent and I thank you. Also, Gary tells me you have contributed over \$3000 for PAC during the second quarter. This is first in Region 5 and ranks 10th among the 50 states. Thanks again.

Eastern Kansas has had more than its share of rain this spring and summer. Flooding and loss of crops, property and homes have been the norm in Eastern Kansas, with 17 to 24 inches of rain falling in a day or so. Some areas the flooding has equaled the disastrous floods of 1951.

I want to call to your attention; taken from the NARFE Web Site: The NARFE-FEEA Natural Disaster Fund, which is supported by NARFE members and administered by the Federal Employee Education and Assistance Fund, can pay out grants up to \$500 per NARFE household to reimburse NARFE members for losses stemming from declared natural disasters. Tax-deductible donations can be sent to NARFE-FEEA Disaster Fund, by sending checks to FEA, 8441 W. Bowles Avenue, Suite 200, Littleton, Co. 80123. Credit Cards can also be used.

There may be some NARFE members in eastern Kansas who fall in the declared disaster category. If you have a NARFE chapter member who falls in this category, make sure they are aware of this disaster information. Jim Gaskell, Area 2A Vice-President: Disasters seem to be the theme of newspapers, TV and other media sources. Southeastern Kansas is now in the news with severe flooding that occurred in late June and the first week in July. Towns and cities in Area 2A severely affected by the flooding are: Fredonia, Neodesha, Independence, Coffeyville, Chanute, and Erie. With four days of rain, this area received from 18 to 26 inches. The water in some areas was higher than the record 1951 flood levels.

I report this to call attention to the program NARFE has called NARFE-FEEA Aid to Disaster Victims. As of this moment, I have learned of no losses to by flooding any of our NARFE members in Area 2A. For that we are very thankful. Our FEEA program can provide \$500 to a NARFE member if they are in a declared natural disaster (flooding and other) and request help from NARFE headquarters. I encourage each person reading this to seek out any NARFE member living in any declared disaster area and share this information with him or her.

Property damages are huge; some homes that were yielding property tax revenues are no longer habitable. The recent Kansas natural disasters will affect legislative meetings for much of the 2008 session, and, as usual, some of the discussions may affect NARFE members. We will be paying close attention to any such matters.

Legislation is still a big item. With our Congressmen and Senators being home on vacation, it will be a good opportunity to contact them. For any of our members who do not have a computer, I recommend they turn to page 16 of the August 2007 NARFE Retirement Life as there is a suggested WEP/GPO Letter for making contact with them. Otherwise, go to the NARFE Web page on your computer.

I recently learned that insurance companies are contacting retirees and have convinced a number of them to cancel their Medicare and take out their insurance plan. They learn that they either have no drug coverage or very little. **DO NOT LET insurance sales people talk you into canceling your MEDICARE. Medicare is your primary coverage and any other health insurance is your secondary coverage, supplemental to Medicare.** The report is that 33,000 persons have canceled their Medicare this year alone and are just beginning to realize what they have lost.

Your NARFE magazine contains a lot of great information, including an article on “The Consumer Price Index and Its Effect on Retiree COLAs.”

CONK is coming up real soon and is a very valuable training program and well worth your time to attend.

Madelyn and June worked very hard during the Bingo games and we all appreciate their efforts and the results!

Through the end of June, Kansas's chapters have collected \$16,458.23, which is \$3.30 per member. The Alzheimer's Committee at the KS Convention set our 2007 Federation contribution goal at \$4.00 per member. Nationally, NARFE has now donated over \$6.9 Million to Alzheimer's Research! It looks like we will make our National NARFE goal of “\$7 Million by 2007”. I am assuming NARFE Headquarters will develop future targets soon. We need to keep on doing what we can to help future researchers find the cause and, hopefully, a cure. Below are some fresh ideas to help us do those...

Ask your Chapter Alzheimer's Chair about the “Blessings Tax” and the “Foodless Food Sale”. These are two fundraising efforts that were developed in Huron South Dakota and shared with us via Barb Pretzer, our Region V and National NARFE Alzheimer's Chair. I forwarded them to your Chapter Alzheimer's Chair/Designee in early July. I especially like the “Blessings Tax” which makes it ‘almost fun’ to make a contribution.
